The distinctive sound of the Mariachi can be heard throughout the plazas of Tlaquepaque (pronounced tuh-la-kay-PAH-kay).

The amazing pyramids of Teotihuacán (pronounced tay-oh-tea-wah-CAHN) are as tall as twenty-story buildings and were built in alignment with the stars and solar system.







It's hard to believe that the neo-Gothic La Parroquia is not a cathedral, but a parish church. It has become the visual symbol of San Miguel de Allende (pronounced san-miguel-day-eye-YEN-day).

The Copper Canyon defies description. It's actually a series of canyons that spreads across 25,000 square miles and plunges to 6,000 feet deep.

GRANDLUXE MEXICO ITINERARY

DAY

EL PASO, TEXAS

The historic gateway to our Mexican adventure. We meet this afternoon at our hotel. If you arrive early, visit downtown with shopping, museums, and a historic steam locomotive display, all within blocks of each other. A motorcoach will transfer you to the train where you will celebrate with your fellow travelers at our Welcome Aboard Dinner. Sleep blissfully in your cabin as your Mexican rail journey begins. (D)

DAY 2 CHIHUAHUA, MEXICO

See the real story of the Mexican Revolution. Chihuahua is a town steeped in history. Revolutionary war hero Pancho Villa's home has been converted into a worldrenowned museum, which is part of our guided city tour. You'll also visit the cathedral and the Quinta Gameros, an exquisite Art Nouveau mansion. Then return to the train for lunch as we begin our journey toward the Copper Canyon. Enjoy dinner aboard the train, and then perhaps a cocktail in the bar car before retiring to your cabin as the train approaches the gateway to the Copper Canyon. (B,L,D)

DAY 3

THE COPPER CANYON

It's been called the most scenic rail journey in the world. And you'll be among the lucky few to find out why. Marvel at the amazing views, the dramatic changes in climate and vegetation, and the sheer engineering genius in this railroad that descends 6,550 feet to the Pacific Ocean through a system of canyons four times as large as the Grand Canyon. In the morning, enjoy the views from the rim of the canyon and take the opportunity to speak with our geologist about the formation of the canyon, hike to various overlooks, or watch as the local Tarahumara Indians perform their dance and display their crafts. In the afternoon, journey down through the canyon on the railroad that took 90 years to build. Stay glued to the window to enjoy both the breathtaking scenery and the feats of engineering that built 37 bridges and 86 tunnels including one that makes a 180-degree turn. Tonight, dine aboard the train as we approach sea level, then fall asleep to the gentle lullaby of the rails as we make our way toward Mazatlán. (B,L,D)

DAY 4

MAZATLÁN AND THE PACIFIC COAST

Discover the many sides of the Pearl of the Pacific. From historic sites to beautiful beaches to luxury resorts, Mazatlán gives visitors plenty to do. Start your day with breakfast aboard the train running along the coast as we arrive in Mazatlán. Then, enjoy one of three daylong excursions. (B,L,D)

History and the Countryside. Enjoy a driving and walking tour of the Historic Center of town before heading into the countryside to a historic hacienda. Here you can enjoy swimming, horseback riding, and hiking, or take a short trip to a local tequila plantation. After lunch, board motorcoaches for the scenic drive to El Quelite, a beautiful and well-preserved example of Mexican village life. Take in a brief historical lecture about the area while enjoying afternoon refreshments.

Water and Wildlife. This exceptional tour of the islands off the coast of Mazatlán includes a visit to a well-maintained wildlife preserve. After a wonderful seafood lunch on one of the islands, spend the afternoon relaxing at the beach, collecting shells, soaking up sun, or splashing in the water.

Spa and Sunshine. This visit to a luxury beachside resort includes full use of all of the facilities, including spa services (for an additional cost), pools, beach cabanas, restaurant, and bar. Add a round of golf (for an additional cost), if you wish.

DAY 5

GUADALAJARA

Live it up in the most Mexican of Mexican cities. Try on the Mexican life here in the home of mariachis, tequila, Mexican crafts, and the Mexican hat dance. Awake to see the agave plantations of the region outside your window, and enjoy breakfast as the train approaches Guadalajara. Today, choose from two tours. (B,L,D)

Tlaquepaque, the craft capital of Mexico. The first tour begins with the Historic Center, where we walk around the Plaza Tapatia and visit the Opera House, Government Palace and the Cathedral, and then later continue on to Tlaquepaque, a major arts and crafts center of Mexico. In Tlaquepaque we will lunch at a restaurant featuring local specialties and then have several hours for shopping and visiting the galleries that line the pedestrian mall.

Tequila—the town and the drink. For our second option, motorcoaches take us to a tour of two tequila distilleries in the nearby town of Tequila. We then return to the city and enjoy the Historic Center before boarding the train in time for dinner.

DAY 6

SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE

Wander through a tourist's

paradise in the colonial heartland. In San Miguel de Allende you can let the historic atmosphere overcome you in these picturesque, narrow, winding streets lined with colonial buildings, where artists and students alike find their inspiration. After breakfast aboard the train, our motorcoach brings us to San Miguel de Allende. Our tour takes us throughout the city, including the plaza, the Parroquia (the famous Gothic-style church), and the Instituto Allende, a renowned school of art. Enjoy the afternoon to peek in at all the art galleries or wander at your leisure before we return to the train for dinner. (B,L,D)

DAY 7 TEOTIHUACÁN

Entering the vast ruins of this ancient city will take your breath away. You'll quickly discover why it's considered one of the most impressive cities of the ancient world. The scale is so vast that visiting Teotihuacán is often compared to visiting the pyramids of Egypt. Pace yourself: the ruins are at 7,000 feet and the grounds are expansive. Your day begins with breakfast on the train at the Teotihuacán station, followed by a very short motorcoach ride to the ruins. Take your time to explore the Pyramid of the Sun, the Pyramid of the Moon, and the temple of Quetzalcoatl (the plumed serpent god), as your guide answers your questions about this mysterious civilization. After our visit to Teotihuacán, a motorcoach takes you to our luxury hotel in Mexico City. (B,L,D)

DAY 8

MEXICO CITY

The oldest city in North America, with centuries of culture on display. Today, we see the best of the city, including Diego Rivera's masterful murals at the Government Palace which tell the history of Mexico from ancient times, the cathedral, the Aztec ruins at the Templo Mayor, and the world-famous Museum of Anthropology. Tonight, our Farewell Dinner is your opportunity to say goodbye to the friends you have made on this amazing rail journey. (B,L,D)

DAY 9

MEXICO CITY

The journey of a lifetime comes to a close. Whether you pack your bags in the morning and head directly to the airport or take a little time to visit more sites and finish up some shopping, you'll feel a profound sense of accomplishment when you look back on how far you have come on this trip. (B)



NATIONAL PARKS OF THE WEST ITINERARY

JACKSON, WYOMING Welcome to GrandLuxe Rail Journeys. Fly into Jackson, Wyoming—often called "Jackson Hole"—and meet your fellow travelers at a special Welcome Dinner. Spend the night at a Jackson/Teton Village area deluxe hotel. (D)

DAY 2 GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK

Be awe-inspired by dramatic mountains that reach straight for the sky. Pine forests and delicate strands of aspen decorate the valley at the base of the serrated Teton Mountains. This morning, explore this mountain range, perhaps the most abrupt and breathtaking in America, with Grand Teton towering 13,770 feet. Centuries ago, Native Americans hunted the great elk herds that gathered here. You'll explore Jenny Lake-majestic, yet tranquil, a favorite site for photographers and sightseers—and the Church of the Transfiguration, a rustic log chapel. For an additional cost, add on an optional excursion that begins with an early breakfast, followed by a gentle, scenic float trip on the Snake River before reuniting with the group. Spend time enjoying the collection at the National Museum of Wildlife Art, which overlooks the elk refuge. After a full day of touring, your deluxe hotel provides dinner and overnight accommodations. (B,L,D)

DAY 3

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

The world's first national park is filled with wildlife and natural wonders. The two million acres of protected land at Yellowstone National Park are inhabited by bears, bald eagles, and herds of bison and elk. More than 10,000 boiling springs, mud pots, and geysers including Old Faithful—are testimony to the geothermal activity rising unusually close to the earth's surface. Guides lead you to the Fountain Paint Pots and to Old Faithful, where you'll stop for lunch. You'll also visit West Thumb Geyser Basin, one of the smallest—yet one of the most scenic—geyser basins in Yellowstone. For an additional cost, add on a 3-mile hike to a backcountry geyser and learn even more about Yellowstone's thermal features. Later, transfer to the train for dinner and the first night onboard the train as we travel to Salt Lake City. (B,L,D)

DAY 4

SALT LAKE CITY AND PARK CITY, UTAH

Discover the many sides of Salt Lake City. Your visit to Utah gives you the opportunity to tour Olympic venues and perhaps even listen to a recital by an organist for the world-famous Mormon Tabernacle Choir in Salt Lake City before unwinding in the beautiful mountain resort town of Park City, site of the recent Winter Olympic Games. Enjoy a night on the train en route to Las Vegas. (B,L,D)



DAY 5

LAS VEGAS, NEVADA WITH OPTIONS TO **ZION** (additional cost)

OR GRAND CANYON

City or Wilderness—you choose.

Spend the day touring Vegas where you can see everything from the Eiffel Tower to the canals of Venice—and indulge in worldclass shopping and dining along the way. Or, choose to visit the Hoover Dam or visit the Grand Canyon's West Rim. For an additional cost, we also offer the option of a Grand Canyon float trip or a day trip by plane to Zion National Park in an area the early settlers called the "Heavenly City of God." Later, enjoy dinner and a night onboard the train as we continue on to the Grand Canyon. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 GRAND CANYON NATIONAL PARK

One of America's most spectacular geologic wonders. Its unfathomable dimensions—277 miles long, 18 miles wide, and a full mile deep make the Grand Canyon one of the nation's most spectacular geologic wonders. We'll spend the day at the South Rim, where the colors of the plateaus and mesas change with the shifting light and shadows. From a stop at Yavapai Point, you can hike to El Tovar, a landmark hotel built in 1905, or continue on to the Mather Point Visitor Center for breathtaking views of the canyon. Enjoy lunch canyonside, with time to stroll along the South Rim from the Hopi House to historic Bright Angel Lodge and Kolb Studio. Back onboard the train, enjoy dinner and then gather around the baby grand piano in the club car as we travel toward Flagstaff. (B,L,D)

DAY 7

SEDONA, ARIZONA

A feast for the eyes and palate.

We awake this morning as the train completes its final leg to Flagstaff, and then board motorcoaches for the short ride to Sedona. Sedona is as full of beautiful art as it is surrounded by natural beauty. Enjoy lunch al fresco (weather permitting) amidst the red rock spires at Sedona's top-rated resort, followed by shopping at Sedona's arts and crafts village or a visit to the littleknown artist community of Jerome. Perched high on the hillside, Jerome's mining history becomes obvious as you stroll the main street and investigate the galleries overlooking the scenic Verde Valley. Back onboard the train, dinner is accompanied by spectacular desert scenery on the way to Santa Fe. (B,L,D)

DAY 8

SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO


"The city different," one of America's great art and culinary capitals. Santa Fe calls itself "the city different," and your visit will clearly show you why. Santa Fe is a city that embraces its natural environment unlike any other in the United States. Renowned for its amazing artists and inventive chefs, Santa Fe is the perfect place to spend the last full day of your GrandLuxe adventure. Enjoy a guided walking tour of downtown and a tour of an artist's home and studio. Take time by yourself to visit the many world-renowned galleries, shops, and museums—including the Georgia O'Keefe Museum and the Institute of American Indian Arts. Enjoy lunch at a fine restaurant in this culinary city. Later, reboard the train for our Farewell Dinner and then cozy up in your cabin for your final night aboard. (B,L,D)

DAY 9

ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO

Say farewell to the friends you've made on your journey. Your GrandLuxe rail journey comes to a close this morning as we arrive in Albuquerque, a city that traces its roots back three centuries. Stay on in Albuquerque for additional sightseeing or head to the airport for flights home. (B)





THE GREAT NORTHWEST & ROCKIES ITINERARY

DAY I

JACKSON, WYOMING Welcome to GrandLuxe Rail Journeys. Fly into Jackson, Wyoming—often called "Jackson Hole"—and meet your fellow travelers at a special Welcome Dinner. Spend the night at a Jackson/Teton Village area deluxe hotel. (D)

DAY 2 GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK

Be awe-inspired by dramatic mountains that reach straight for the sky. Centuries ago, Native Americans hunted the great elk herds that gathered here. Pine forests and delicate strands of aspen decorate the valley at the base of the serrated Teton Mountains. This morning, explore this mountain range, perhaps the most abrupt and breathtaking in America, with Grand Teton towering 13,770 feet. You'll explore Jenny Lake—majestic, yet tranquil, a favorite site for photographers and sightseers—and the Church of the Transfiguration, a rustic log chapel. For an additional cost, add on an optional excursion that begins with an early breakfast, followed by a gentle, scenic float trip on the Snake River before reuniting with the group. Spend time enjoying the collection at the National Museum of Wildlife Art, which overlooks the elk refuge. After a full day of touring, your deluxe hotel provides dinner and overnight accommodations. (B,L,D)

DAY 3

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

The world's first national park is filled with wildlife and natural wonders. More than 10,000 boiling springs, mud pots, and geysers—including Old Faithful—are testimony to the geothermal activity rising unusually close to the earth's surface. The two million acres of protected land at Yellowstone National Park are inhabited by bears, bald eagles, and herds of bison and elk. Guides lead you to West Thumb Geyser Basin, one of the smallest—yet one of the most scenic—geyser basins in Yellowstone. You also visit Fountain Paint Pots and Old Faithful, where you'll stop for lunch. For an additional cost, add on a 3-mile hike to a backcountry geyser and learn even more about Yellowstone's thermal features. Later, transfer to the train for dinner and the first night onboard the train as we travel to Helena. (B,L,D)

DAY 4 HELENA, MONTANA

Experience Montana's rich history and scenery. The state capital offers a sense of Montana's history as you tour the city and its landmarks. Dedicated in 1902, the capitol building houses commemorative western artwork, including Charles M. Russell's largest painting. At the Montana Historical Society Museum, explore permanent exhibits on this territory and its native cultures. Alternatively, you may choose to visit Holter Lake, a reservoir on the Missouri River, and board a boat for a cruise to Gates of the Mountain—1,200-foot cliffs that create the illusion of gates opening to the mountains. Named by Lewis and Clark during their Corps of Discovery expedition, the limestone cliffs also contain ancient petroglyphs. Enjoy beautiful scenery as we leave Helena and ride the rails towards Glacier National Park. (B,L,D)

DAY 5 GLACIER NATIONAL PARK

A million acres of beauty. Glacier National Park encompasses more than a million acres of cedar, hemlock, fir, and pine forests; green alpine meadows; and hundreds of lakes. Its diverse habitats are home to over 70 species of mammals and over 260 species of birds. You'll tour this spectacular wonderland via the Going to the Sun Road, a 52-mile highway that splits the park east and west. Crossing the Continental Divide at 6,646-foot Logan Pass, the Going to the Sun Road gives you an ideal vantage point to observe virtually every type of terrain in the park, from the forested lower valleys dotted with glacial lakes to the windswept alpine tundra at the pass. Back onboard the train, enjoy dinner as we continue west to Coeur d'Alene. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 COEUR D'ALENE, IDAHO

Wake to breakfast onboard as

we head towards Coeur d'Alene. This gorgeous lakefront resort town has a ruggedly beautiful setting. Named "sharp-hearted" by French traders in respect for the tough trading practices of local Indian tribes, the city has become one of the Northwest's most popular vacation spots. After breakfast on the train, set out for a tour of the local area, featuring lunch on the lake. Watch for moose, bald eagles, and other wildlife. (B,L,D)

DAY 7

COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE OR CASCADES

Ride the rails. Enjoy a full day of running on the train as one beautiful sight after another unfolds outside your window. We will either travel through Washington's Cascade Mountains or through the Columbia River Gorge. The stunning Columbia River Gorge is a spectacular 80mile-long river canyon that cuts the only sea-level route through the Cascade Mountain Range, with a depth of up to 4,000 feet. One of the day's highlights is sure to be afternoon tea featuring pastries made onboard the train. Overnight on the train as we head to Mt. Rainier. (B,L,D)

DAY 8

MT. RAINIER NATIONAL PARK

Take the Road to Paradise. Today the train parks at the base of 14,410-foot Mt. Rainier, the third-highest mountain in the Lower 48. Here you'll board a motorcoach and take the Road to Paradise, one of the park's main lookouts, which offers an unparalleled view of Mt. Rainier's summit. As you walk through the park, be on the lookout for more than 200 varieties of wildflowers. Back onboard the train, enjoy a farewell dinner en route to Seattle. (B,L,D)

DAY 9

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

Your GrandLuxe rail journey comes to a close. We arrive in Seattle's historic King Street Station this morning. Stay on in Seattle for additional sightseeing—including the Space Needle, Pike Place Market, and ferries to nearby islands—or head to the airport for flights home. (B)



DAY 2 RAIL THROUGH THE COLORADO ROCKIES

A daylight ride through the incomparable Rocky Mountains.

After your first breakfast aboard your GrandLuxe train, sit back and enjoy the show as we take you through some of the country's most stunning mountain scenery. Climb the Front Range of the Rockies to the Moffat Tunnel, one of the most famous railroad tunnels in America, whose 6-mile length through the Continental Divide enables trains to bypass 27 miles of difficult railroad. With average daily progress of just 21 feet, the tunnel took four years to bore and was completed in 1928. 





Step into one of our dining cars and you enter an intimate atmosphere offering outstanding cuisine at elegant tables, each with an ever-changing view. Every dining car has been configured to give you the most comfortable dining experience on the rails. As in any fine restaurant, fresh-cut flowers adorn the room. Tables for two and four invite conversation. But all conversation stops when dishes such as our signature Butternut Squash Soup arrive, served by a wait staff that prides itself on providing topnotch service.



OBSERVATION CAR

Lustrous mahogany panels. Gleaming brass fixtures. Sleek lines. And plush upholstered chairs and couches. Welcome to our legendary New York observation car. Relax in its spectacular viewing salon. As you enjoy a cocktail, marvel at the scenery, and converse with fellow travelers, it hits you: you're reliving the past. You're aboard a car that evokes a time of romantic and adventurous rail travel—but with modern appointments such as plush swivel rockers with slender tables for writing, playing cards, reading, or sipping refreshments. This car has been nicknamed the Lookout Lounge because of it bow-tailed window seats. The 1940s-era lounge car, originally built for the Union Pacific Railroad, is decidedly sophisticated. Soak up the sun or take in the starry velvet night—our glass-enclosed dome car offers 360-degree viewing. In the 1950s, the dome was advertised in National Geographic as the state-ofthe-art in rail innovation. Today, its practical construction makes it a classic. Built by the Budd Company in 1953 for the Southern Pacific's Daylight, this car seats 72 people in an upper-level glass enclosure that affords a nonstop view of the surrounding countryside. It's equipped with a bar, library, a through passage on the lower level, and the Passenger Services Office.

ADA POLICY

The GrandLuxe Rail Journeys Train was refurbished before the American's with Disabilities Act; and therefore, it does not comply with ADA standards. Certain safety regulations affecting the design of the train may cause difficulty for persons with limited mobility. The carriages cannot accommodate wheelchairs or walkers. The hallways in the sleeping carriages are 24 inches wide, and doorways leading into the cabins are 18 inches wide. Wheelchairs for off-train tours must be provided by passenger, be collapsible, and be stored in the passenger's cabin. Motorized scooters are not permitted due to limited storage availability.

Dear Friend,




